2. Manuscript form

The electronic manuscript, including tables and figures should be submitted as a Microsoft Word document (.doc or .docx). The publisher also welcomes original electronic graphic files for figures or tables (EPS for vector graphics exported from a drawing program, TIFF,

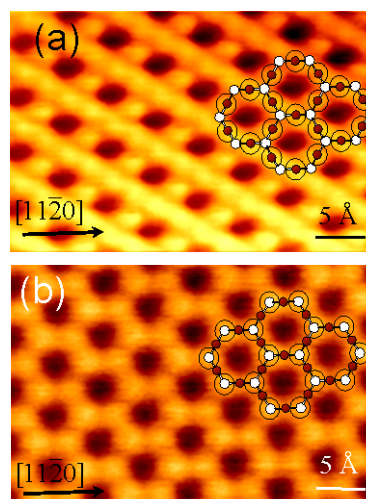


Fig. 1: Use minimum number of figures required. You cannot use same indications for different tables or figures. Information given in captions should not be repeated in the text. 10point; 9.95pt paragraph (after: 0.2 lines).

or JPEG). Each manuscript should be accompanied by a “Complete List of Submitted Materials”. Note that incomplete or improperly prepared manuscripts shall be returned to authors before the review process.

All figures, whether photographs, graphs, or diagrams, should be cited in the text and numbered sequentially with Arabic numerals.

Abbreviations should be defined at first appearance. You cannot use abbreviations in the title and abstract.

Manuscripts should be carefully checked by a native English speaker who is familiar with the field of the work.

3. How to write references

Put numbers, not alphabets, to references in the order of citation in the text. The author should take responsible for the accuracy of reference data. For every reference, indicate the start page number and all authors’ names (Initial letters of given name first, and then full spelled surname). You cannot use “et al.” in the reference list.

3.1 Journals and proceedings **Section title: 10point bold; 1 line paragraph (after: 0.2 lines)**

Indicate all authors’ names, abbreviated journal title in *Italic*, volume number in bold, start page number, and published year in parentheses¹⁾. For proceedings, presentation number and place (name of the city) are also required²⁾.

Indicate all authors’ names, book title in *Italic*, edition number, publisher name, published place, and published year in parentheses³⁾. For coauthored books, indicate all editors’ names and start page number of the section⁴⁾.

Indicate names of individuals, institutions or programs (if any) who have made important (especially financial) contributions for authors’ related study and research.
